### Introduction

*In its simplest form, an e-portfolio is a tool that allows learners to record and present their achievements and personal progress in a digital format. In a broader sense, it could also support activities such as reflection, planning, sharing, and collaboration. Capturing this information and enabling these activities could take place within a webspace, blog, or in a more structured, template-based system.*

*Interest in e-portfolios has increased as the lifelong-learning and personalisation agendas have emerged. The extent to which e-portfolios can contribute towards employability and the transition between school, college and university has also driven developments.*

*The findings of two JISC-funded regional projects on the use of e-portfolios to support student progression will set a context for this event and a focus for our discussions. You will also have the opportunity to examine two e-portfolio tools and consider their implications for your learners and your institution.*

### Who should attend?

This conference is aimed at managers, teaching, support and technical staff in the FE, HE and ACL sectors who have a key role in implementing an e-portfolio within their institution.

### Aims of day:

To examine the current use of e-portfolios within the region and examine the use of e-portfolios and their suitability for your learners and your institution.
